1 An act to require all persons to take a minimum of five driver’s education classes.

3 **Be it enacted by the Youth Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky**

4  
5 **Section 1:**

6 In the first year on the road, teens are 10 times more likely to get into an accident. On average 450,000  
7 teens die in the United States annually. About 11 teens die daily from car crashes. Kentucky is ranked 9th in  
8 the United States for teen accidents. In Kentucky 24.2% of fatal car accidents are caused by teen drivers.

10 **Section 2:**

11 This bill is to make it a requirement for all people to take five driver’s education classes before getting their  
12 restricted license. These classes will be funded by the state, and will take place at each city’s DMV office.

14 **Section 3:**

15 The effects of this bill will be, the state will have better teen drivers than before. It will decrease our teen  
16 accident rate and automobile fatality rate. This bill will also help reduce the cost of insurance, because of  
17 less teen accidents.

19 **Section 4:**

20 This Bill will go into effect immediately, as to cause less accidents caused by teens in Kentucky.
