

Bill Sharing

Bill Sharing is a time before Committees for Bill Authors to educate others about their bill, so that delegates will be more informed in Committees. This will be done in an informal setting where delegates are allowed to roam throughout their committee and become better prepared for debate while gaining an increased understanding of the Author's ideas.

- A. The Bill Sharing will take place in the same locations as Committee Meetings and will lead immediately into Committees
- B. Legislative, Premiere, and Congressional Authors and Delegates will participate in Bill Sharing. Congressional Bill Sharing will be the entirety of the first night while Legislative and Premiere will only be a portion
- C. Each set of bill authors will receive half of a 6' by 2' table on which to display information about their bill.
- D. All Delegates will attend the Bill Sharing in their assigned Committee, and will be expected to ask questions of Bill Authors. Delegates will also fill out an informational sheet about bills in their committee.
- E. Authors are encouraged to create simple educational materials about their bills, such as tri-fold boards (access to electricity is not guaranteed). Authors will stay at their tables and are expected to answer questions about their bill and to attract students to their display.
- F. Stickers, pamphlets, candy, and any other items to be distributed are not allowed at the Bill Sharing.
