

PROPOSAL WRITING CHECKLIST

The following are characteristics of a strong proposal:

- -The proposal explains the subject in clear, non-specialized, concise language
- -The proposal is a brief as possible while still providing adequate explanation of proposed UN action
- -If the proposal amends existing UN policy, both the current policy and the proposed changes should be stated
- -It contains the enacting clause, **BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS.**
- -It is divided into sections, so that every component of the proposal may be easily understood
- -Major provisions of the proposal should be stated in the first sections.
- -Definitions of terms are included, if necessary.
- -If money will be required to fund or enforce the provisions of this proposal, its source is specified
- -Penalties and incentives for compliance are clearly stated.
- -The proposal states (usually in the last section) when the proposed policy would become effective. Many proposals state, "90 days following passage." However, a proposal can become effective any time after passage by the Assembly.
