Title: **An act to require verification of age and plausible pay on cocoa farms**

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Justification Clause: This proposal will cause an age restriction of child labor in cocoa farms. As work in cocoa farms is hostile and inhospitable, it should require various limitations, when you are in that position. As such, these limitations should include age restrictions and a standard salary. This will cause a decrease in child labor or slavery. The restrictions are that the workers must be of the age of at least 16. The pay will be of at least 40,000 francs (around 90 U.S. dollars) a month.

Section I: This proposal will be overseen by UNICEF by doing yearly inspections at all cocoa farms to make sure all regulations are in order. This will affect the owners of the cocoa farms by possibly costing them more money to pay the workers or to find new workers.

Section II: This proposal will not cost anything. The only resources it will cost from UNICEF are volunteers that can inspect the farms and will enforce the restrictions. For each offense of these restrictions, a fine will be ensued. The first offense is a 5,000 franc fine (10 U.S. dollars). The second offense will be a fine of 15,000 francs (30 U.S. dollars). The third and final offense will be punished by a suspension of teh cocoa farm for one year. For every offense after is punished by a one year suspension.

Section III: This proposal will go into effect one year after its passing.
