Title: An act to publish a law to decrease the amount of human trafficking in the United Arab Emirates.

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Justification Clause: The UAE is one of many countries that reports daily on human trafficking. Both women and children are tricked into slavery and prostitution almost every day, with over 200,000 confirmed reports. Of these, 3,400 are children in the Middle East alone. We propose to lower the amount of victims and put and end to this horrible crime.

Section I: Currently, there is no law to abolish human trafficking in the United Arab Emirates. To correct this, we plan to establish a new law that consists of lowering the number of victims of slavery, forced prostitution, and sex trade through the establishment of stiff monetary penalties.

Section II: The UAE government and the United Nations would oversee and enforce this law.

Section III: Consequences will be as follows: First Offense: 650 AED Dirhams will be fined, followed with 1,300 Dirhams for the second offense.

This proposal shall go into effect immediately upon passage.
