Title: An act to create an all female emergency peacekeeping force to aid communities in response to acts of violence against women.

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Justification Clause: Today out of approximately 125,000 peacekeepers, women make up 3% of military personnel and 10% of police personnel. While these numbers are higher than they were a decade ago they are not high enough to meet the needs of emergency situations in addition to the permanent positions. Currently, four countries have contributed permanent, all female, peacekeeping forces including: Indian in Liberia; Bangladeshi in Haiti and Samoan in Timor;

Section I - The all female emergency response peacekeeping force will consist of 100 soldiers. These will be in addition to existing peacekeeping forces. No one will lose a job.

Section II- Peacekeeping soldiers are paid by their own governments according to their own national rank and salary scale. Countries volunteering uniformed personnel to peacekeeping operations are reimbursed by the UN at a flat rate of a little over US\$1,028 per soldier per month, as most recently approved by the General Assembly in 2002.

Section III- No country will be asked to contribute more than then additional soldiers so that the financial obligation is distributed throughout several members countries.

Section IV- After three years a committee will be formed to evaluate the all female emergency peace keeping task force to see if it should continue to be a part of the United Nations' work.

Section V- The task force will form and begin training in January of 2014.
