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Title: An act to maintain peace in the Caucus Region by the use of peacekeepers and humanitarian aid.

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Justification Clause: Throughout our nation's history, we have had the ever possible threat of war with Russia. Now, the threat increases as the world is indifferent and unknowing of our plight. This is also a worldwide problem, as the safety of the Republic of Georgia and our neighbors is at stake. We request a resolution to uphold peace. The UN should include international peacekeepers in our nation, as Poland, Ukraine, Lithuania have already volunteered to man such a force. The UN has maintained peace in Cyprus and Kosovo and has succeeded in those places. Peace is just as necessary in Georgia, and requires cooperation from all parties. This includes Chechens, Cossacks, Ossetian Militia, and most of all Russia. The people are afraid to walk down the street, ethnic Georgians are left unprotected in South Ossetia, and border clashes create tensions. Clearly peace is needed to secure our nation and the region.

Section I: In order to preserve peace between Georgia, Russia, and South Ossetia, we request peacekeeping bases with humanitarian efforts to aid refugees and rebuild damaged areas. These will be established in cities located near and to the East of South Ossetia and along the borders of Georgia and Russia and other conflict zones. Humanitarian efforts will be focused on aiding the refugees and rebuilding the damaged villages in the area of Kemerti and Gudjabauri. Troops from aiding countries will be sent to the borders of Georgia to prevent the escalation of violence between Georgia and the Russian and South Ossetian forces.

Section II: The approximate cost will be 830 million Georgian Lari (500,000,000 US). The U.N. spends about 7.33 billion on peacekeeping worldwide already. Almost all of the money to pay for this, however, will have to be paid for by the countries who have volunteered to aid Georgia, considering that more than half of the residents of Georgia live in poverty. The country will need financial support until it has recovered enough from the war. The countries that assist in defensive efforts may also be encouraged to help in humanitarian aid to the almost 192,000 displaced refugees.

Section III: The proposal will take effect immediately. First, peacekeeping troops will be placed along the border regions where the threat of violence is the greatest. Also the presence of an international peacekeeping force will be known to Russia and the militia of South Ossetia. There are currently only 275, unarmed international "peacekeepers" in Georgia, and do not have the ability to prevent violence in the region. With this international peacekeeping force we will put an end to continuous border clashes and ethnic violence in the region. Secondly, will be the building of humanitarian headquarters in and around South Ossetia to help rebuild the region from the conflict in 2008.

Section IV: Putting this proposal into effect would benefit the country of Georgia and the world. If successful, the United Nations will be able to send peacekeepers to other regions of the world to prevent violence and rebuild lives that were damaged as a result. The people of Georgia would be able to return to their homes and live a better life. Resolving the conflict between Georgia and Russia would benefit both countries.
