Title: A proposal to amend the United Nations Security Council (UNSC).

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Justification Clause: The five veto members of the Security Council have a greater power than the general assembly of the United Nations Council (UNC). When a proposal is brought up to the UNC one veto notation from any of the participants of the UNSC can diminish the proposal. This shows inequality amongst the nations. Our solution to this is simple; have 5 representatives from modified, clustered continents. These regions would include -Central and North America (region 1), Africa (region 2); Asia and Australia (region 3) will be another, Europe (region 4), and then finally South America (region 5).

Section I: A vote will be held by every country in a clustered region to decide who will represent them in the UNSC. The five permanent members of the council will begin switching out every two years. In 2014, all regions will hold an election. In 2016, regions 1,2 and 3 will hold new elections. In 2018 regions 4 and 5 will be hold elections. This cycle will continue in this style.

Section II: If one of the elected veto nations performs any illegal actions, the participants of the United Nations Security Council shall agree to sanctions that will be enforced by the General Assembly. These sanctions will consist of closing their country's sea ports, place a tariff on sea imports and exports, or suspend their seat from the UNSC for a term.

Section III: These violations will be enforced by the United Nations General Assembly. To keep peace within the United Nations Council, the General Assembly will vote on the violations committed to determine the follow through with punishing the accused country(s). A 2/3 vote will decide on the passing. The exact sanction placed on the country will be voted on and be based on the action being questioned.

Section IV: This proposal does not cause any economic impact on the United Nations.

Section V: This proposal will go into effect on the New Year (2014).
