Title: A proposal to create a worldwide guard that will protect trade vessels from pirate attacks.

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Justification Clause: Recently there has been an increase in pirate attacks across the board. Most of those attacks have occurred in the Indian Ocean where the ships that have been attacked have no way of defending themselves. These vessels carry important goods that help push the rest of the world's economy. Each ship that is captured or destroyed by the pirates is a potential source of income for a number of other countries. In 2011 piracy cost the world 7 billion dollars total, 7 billion dollars that could be used to solve other problems. In order to solve this problem of pirates the UN and all of the nations that are part of it should help to establish the Counter Piracy Patrol Force. The Counter Piracy Patrol Force is a group of trained navy professionals from any country who will protect harbors and bays in places like Somalia from pirate attacks. These officers will be trained by the British navy and will be responsible for keeping trade ships and tourist ships safe from pirate attacks.

Section I:The officers will be trained by the British navy for 2 months and have to have at least 2 years of naval combat experience before. The training will consist of the officers learning the 1000 sq km area they will be patrolling, as well as citizen safety precautions.

Section II: Once trained, the patrol officers will be transported via flight to an aircraft carrier stationed in the ocean off the coast of Somalia. They will then be assigned their ship and will begin patrolling immediately.

Section III: The patrol force will consist of 10 to 20 ships maximum, the number of ships present will be based on the pirate activity in the area. These ships will be destroyers and battleships that are capable of stopping pirates.

Section IV: : Each ship will approximately cost 1.75 million dollars and will be paid for by the nations that the force protects. These ships will be manufactured on British seas then moved too Somalia in order to protect it.

Section V: This will go into effect immediately after being passed.
