Title: An act to promote fair and equal treatment to women around the world.

**BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS**

Justification Clause: Women are not treated with the same respect as men in many areas of the world. Women are considered breeding stock and nothing more. They find it difficult to get a proper education, which in turn makes it harder for them to find a job to pay for the basic necessities of life.
