Title: **A proposal to establish a program that aids Syria's move to meet the basic human needs; Sanitation**

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Justification Clause: A proposal to collaborate with Syria's Government, UNICF and Bill and Melinda Gates foundation to develop an effective sanitation program within the country of Syria, which is presently lacking for the majority of the population. According to the United Nations, 2.6 billion people are without adequate sanitation. Unfortunately, 70% of the Syria's population is without this basic human need: Sanitation.

Section I: the Syrian population is exposed to environmental health risk because of the lack of sanitation services in Syria. the severe disruption of water and sanitation services and a lack of basic hygiene increased the risk of diseases? Cholera, Tuberculosis, Typhoid, Hepatitis A, and Leprosy.

Section II: Whereas; Syria is at pre-crisis water level. many families have six gallons of water a day compared to nineteen gallons of water two years ago. U.N.I.C.F will send in 300,000 chlorine tablets to aid in the sanitation of water immediately.

Section III: In order to treat the requirements of better hygiene and sanitation, they would have to use founding form the U.N.I.C.F and Bill and Melinda Gates foundation to develop an effective sanitation system which would include/obtain latrine pan, Hygienic and adequate pit/tank emptying and extraction process.

Section IV: U.N.I.C.F and Teachers Across Borders would organize committees to educate Syria's citizens on water treatment plans and waste management programs.

Section V: This proposal will go into effect 30 days upon passage.
