Title: An act to help reduce poverty and increase education in Nigeria.

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Justification Clause: Poverty is a growing problem in Nigeria. There are many causes for poverty in Nigeria. A couple of these causes are overpopulation and loss of education that puts people out of work. We believe that if we propose new education laws and scholarships for educational programs then there will be an increase in jobs. All of this will decrease poverty and other major problems such as HIV/Aids, teenage pregnancy, and an unstable government.

Section I: The rates of poverty are increasing every year; approximately 70% of the population is in poverty. Many deaths in Nigeria are caused by conditions which result from poverty such as bad environments for mothers and growing children. This causes children to die of starvation. This is similar to cases in the past, like Ethiopia.

Section II: We propose to establish an educational program that will provide more shelters for growing children and increase job opportunities in the health care field.

Section III: This solution will send teachers to Nigeria to educate people, therefore increasing job opportunities for the Nigerian citizens. What we plan to do is send a number of teachers to Nigeria from the US to educate Nigerian citizens so they can teach those who aren't fortunate enough to go to school. We plan to build 10 basic shelters which will cost close to \$8000 per shelter. The shelters will provide a home for the homeless and a mandatory educational course. The courses will be sex education, basic knowledge, and home economics class (first aid, cooking, cleaning, etc.) these will help with providing common knowledge. The costs will be \$600 per plane ticket, \$2600 per apartment, \$250 for food per month all costs apply to educators; one apartment can hold four educators. We will need about 20 educators per shelter.

Section IV: The proposal will go into affect within a year of passage such as July 15th, 2014 due to finding the right people for the program such as willing teachers and more sponsors. When this proposal goes into effect it will solve the universal problem of poverty in Nigeria.
