Title: An act to impeach Robert Mugabe in international court of the U.N. for breaking human rights laws

## BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Justification Clause: The country Zimbabwe is falling under an economic crisis, failing government affecting the whole country, and the decline of human rights that needs to be stopped. Robert Mugabe the "President" of Zimbabwe has really taken over the country and is abusing his power, by brutally killing protesters, innocent political opponents and citizens of Zimbabwe that vote against him with no one to stop him because of his party. He also rigs elections so that he wins every time. Robert Mugabe's reign has kept what used to be "The Bread Basket of Africa" to be coming one of the world's most failing countries.
