## BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

## Justification Clause:

Right now, there is no limit on the nuclear weapons a country is aloud to claim possession to, but we are encouraging all nations to have a limit on nuclear weapons.
