Title: An act to reduce the amounts of air pollution released into the air in Europe.

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Justification Clause: Europe is producing large amounts of air pollution, which is seeping into the atmosphere of several countries and causing serious respiratory health problems. Europe needs to lower the amounts of air pollution they are allowing into their air and water supply. This initiative will be started In Europe and if proven successful could be used on other continents.

Section I: The United Nations will provide a task force made up of five environmental scientists from UNEP (United Nations Environmental Pro-gramme) to enter all European countries to test their air quality. Any country who is emitting more than the NAAQS recommendation will then be educated on air pollution and the effects left on the country as well provided with solutions on how they can reduce the air pollutants.

Section II: The task force will check for the six primary gases being released into the air: sulfur dioxide, nitrogen dioxide, lead, ozone, carbon monoxide, and particle pollution.

They will use the recommended guidelines from the Clean Air Act established by the EPA (Environmental Protection Agency) called the National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS).

Section III: The task force who will educate the country on the health risks and what they can do to emit less air pollution, will investigate what the main substances are that are being emitted; therefore they will be able to focus on certain solutions for each individual country.

Section IV: Salaries for the task force members along with the cost to test the air quality will be funded through UNEP. Countries needing to improve their air quality may apply for financial assistance from the European Union and UN in order to implement the recommended solutions.

Section V: This proposal will go into effect 6 months after it's passing.
