Title: An act to stop the illegal trade, smuggling and production of cocaine in Peru by offering incentives to other counties.

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Justification Clause: Peru is the second largest producer of cocaine; more than seventy percent of the cocaine is shipped to other countries. Many cocaine induced seizures happen every year and some are responsible for death. Any consumption of cocaine by pregnant women could result in a "crack baby" making them addicted cocaine earlier in life. Cocaine is also used in surgeries as a means of stopping bleeding. So any cocaine that is found is used to turn a profit for the countries by selling them to legal medical companies.

Section I: 25% of the monetary value of the cocaine seized is given to the country that found the cocaine while searching shipments from Peru.

Section II: This will be enforced by Peruvian Police by having the cocaine sent back to Peru for the creation of legal drugs for surgeries which is then sold to medical companies.

Section III: This incentive will be covered by the profit of the medical supplies created.

Section IV: Any country found keeping the cocaine will not receive the incentive and will have any and all trade ceased with Peru.

Section V: This proposal will go into effect 12 months after passage.
