Title: An act to abolish the Non-Proliferation Treaty enacted in 1970 restricting the spread of nuclear weapons

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Justification Clause: Since 1968, over 180 countries have signed the Nonproliferation Treaty. This treaty limits the spread of nuclear technology for military purposes from non-nuclear nations looking to build or acquire atomic weapons. Yet, many countries that have signed this treaty have nuclear war heads already deployed, non-deployed but ready for use, or retired and waiting to be dismantled. By this proposal, we hope to abolish this treaty as it puts a halt on some country's progression of nuclear technology, such as Iran, yet has allowed other counties who could be potentially as dangerous to continue to have capable warheads in their possession.

Section I: The United States of America and Russia currently both hold over 7,500 nuclear warheads, otherwise known as nuclear weapons meant for war. Although these weapons are not currently in use, they are still capable of being activated and deployed. The current treaty in place, the Non-proliferation Treaty, restricts the spread of nuclear technology between countries and limits the rights of other countries like Iran, who have no nuclear advancements to this day. Other countries, such as Russia and the United States, who were some of the first countries to sign the treaty still have thousands of nuclear weapons to date, so why is Iran being criticized over just experimenting with nuclear technology. Iran has the right to have not only nuclear energy but nuclear weapons. Eliminating this treaty will grant countries like Iran rights they deserve that are being ignored by the super power countries such as the United States.
