Title: An act to construct more oil mining facilities in the country of south Sudan.

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

JUSTIFICATION CLAUSE: Our country, South Sudan, has just recently gotten out of civil war. This dispute has caused many South Sudanese people to become un-employed and our poverty rate is skyrocketing. Over 4 million people don't make enough income to satisfy their basic needs, according to a local survey. BODY:
