Title: **An act to require that puncture resistant gloves be worn by all those who clean fish that are served or sold to the public.**

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

**Justification Clause:**

In Barbados, fish are plentiful. Fish are served and sold to the public quite frequently. In some cases, the hands of those cleaning the fish are punctured or cut by the barbs on the fish. The blood from these punctures and cuts can contaminate the fish if just washed off with water, which is most often what happens. This practice can spread many blood borne diseases such as hepatitis and AIDS. Wearing puncture resistant gloves could help prevent these diseases from being spread.

**Section I:**

The Department of Public Health of each country will include this requirement in their inspections and it will be enforced by the World Health Organization.

**Section II:**

It will be the responsibility of each business to provide their workers who clean fish with the puncture resistant gloves.

**Section III:**

This proposal will take effect 90 days after passage.
