Title: **An act to keep family farms from going bankrupt during an economic crisis.**

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Justification Clause:

The olive oil crisis drastically decreased prices to a 10 year low because, Spain lost 600,000 tonnes (metric unit) of olives, after its devastating drought. This hasn't only affected Spain's family farms, but Italy and Greece's family farms as well. Spain exports 60 percent of its olive oil to more than 100 countries. If this keeps happening Spain, Italy, And Greece's family farms will go bankrupt, and soon all consumers won't be able to buy from these 3 countries. Many countries find themselves in the same situation with their own agricultural products. since family farms are an essential way to feed the world, we need to make sure they don't disappear.

Section I: Create a united nations commission that can help farmers store goods until prices improve and support family farms in short term distress.

Section II: The commission will help farmers find quicker access to World Bank funds and economic support in their own country, and economic relief from other sources in the world.

Section III: The United Nations, through the commission, will provide lawyers, translators, financial analysts, agricultural experts to help farmers cut through red tape, become more efficient planning for the future, and institute modern agricultural techniques.

Section IV: This proposal will go into effect within ninety days of passage.
