Title: **An act to organize a council whose purpose is to tackle complications involving invasive species.**

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Justification Clause: Whereas invasive species are an international threat to a community's economy, environment, and the health of an individual, both physically and mentally, and since the invasive species council of Australia has been able to prevent any major introduction of non-native species within the borders of the countries ever since the cane toad epidemic, and since multiple first world nations such as the United States have invested some form of power and wealth towards the protection from foreign species,

Section I: The United Nations would assemble a group of credited scientists, environmentalists, economists, and governmental bureaucrats to voluntarily design a method to tackle the issue of invasive species.

Section II: The conflicts in discussion may include but are not limited to: how species are introduced into a new environment, how nations can prevent the introduction of non-native species, and if an invasive species has already established the environment as their habitat, what procedure can we take in order to eliminate the invasive species, or to ensure that the new species will not harm the natural ecosystem of other species including the human population.

Section III: The first and foremost issue that the panel will tackle will be a resolution that stops the introduction of an invasive species, since that is the leading cause to the effects of invasive species.

Section IV: If any nation refuses to take the advice of the council, the nation must therefore create their own solution that is able to oppose the reason why they were not able to adhere to the original solution.

Section V: A. whereas the proposal will be followed in its entirety, it will benefit the international community in which the controversies revolving around invasive species will diminish almost entirely. B. Whereas in a situation where this proposal is not passed, the consequence would outweigh the benefits substantially. The consequence being that the number of invasive species will continue to grow in numerous countries, most likely due to human fault.

Section VI: whereas the proposal will take effect within one year of passage and all proposals in conflict with this decree will be considered an opposition and will be taken into account after the proposal has been passed.
