Title: An act to diminish human trafficking in the country know as Kenya by developing an office for the Polaris Project.

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Justification Clause: Human trafficking is a huge issue in Kenya and 161 other countries. Approximately 12.3 million men, women, and children are trafficked for commercial sex or forced labor all around the world today. Trafficking is estimated to be a \$32 billion industry. Although government corruption is a huge issue and needs to be addressed, there is also a great need to help the victims that continue on with their lives destroyed by this practice. We will need assistance to eradicate human/sex trafficking implementing the services provided through the Polaris Project. Services include:

- Emergency services
- Comprehensive case management
- Group therapy
- Transitional housing
- Victim outreach

Section 1: Offices will be staffed by Kenyans trained by Polaris Project employees from Washington D.C. headquarters. In order to get the office up and running, the office will be directed by one Polaris Project representative who will oversee the 5 managers of the services provided. There will be a 12-18 month interim period to train Kenyan professionals in the practices and services of the Polaris Project. After that time, the office will be completely directed and managed by Kenyans.

Section 2: We are asking for the bill to be funded by \$1 million donations for:

- Technology
- Personnel: hiring, training, and maintaining
- · Office Space: refurbishing and furnishing

We are asking that funding come from the following organizations:

- UNODC- United Nations of Drugs and Crime is the global leader in the fight against illicit drugs and international crime.
- UN- The United Nations work for peace and security for people around the globe.
- CATW- Coalition against Trafficking in Women is a non-governmental organization that works to end human trafficking and the commercial sexual exploitation of women and children worldwide.

They are the first organization to fight human trafficking internationally.

Section 3: The main headquarters will be located in Kenya's Capitol, Nairobi.
