Title: An act to train medical professionals through a new non-profit organization headquartered in Malawi.

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Justification Clause: Due to Malawi and other southern African countries' outlandishly low numbers of trained medical professionals and the high percentage of preventable maternal deaths, we propose a new program to give medical professionals, specifically doctors and nurses, the training they require by funding a non-profit medical training group. This proposal acts to aid the vulnerable people- especially pregnant women and new mothers- located in Africa by training professionals in close proximity to many villages.

Section I:Men and women of Malawi, Zambia, Zimbabwe, Mozambique, Botswana, Angola, and South Africa will be trained at a new center for professional medical training located in Lilongwe, Malawi and receive full nurse or doctor licensure. In exchange for receiving training, these doctors and nurses will be required to practice medicine in their own country for at least three years.

Section II:We will fund our new non-profit organization with an annual \$2,000,000 grant from the United Nations for training medical professionals. In addition, we will also use the HIV/AIDS grant Malawi already receives.

Section III:Malawi counts as a LLDC (landlocked developing country) under UN regulations, so the money to fund this program will come from the UN Second Committee (the Economic and Financial Committee). Malawi will be the location for headquarters, because it has the lowest proportional rate of doctors and nurses to the general population and, therefore, has the greatest immediate need.

Section IV: This proposal will go into effect September 1st, 2013 at the beginning of the next meeting of the United Nations General Assembly.
