Title: A proposal to prevent the furthering of human trafficking in Guatemala and to improve the current methods against human trafficking.

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Justification Clause:In the country of Guatemala, an estimated 2,000 children are being sexually exploited. Young girls are coerced into being domestic servants and adults are forced to work on coffee plantations or in municipal dumps. Guatemala has a 5 person anti-trafficking police unit. Anti-trafficking police and prosecutors are plagued by lack of resources and funding. Also, while child victims are eligible for care at government run shelters, there are no shelters for adults.

Section I: UNODC (United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime) will create a \$250,000 fund for the Guatemalan anti-trafficking police unit.

Section II: The Guatemalan police and government officials will be provided with the UNODC Toolkit to Combat Trafficking in Persons.

Section III: The UNODC PSA pertaining to human trafficking will be broadcasted on radio and television. Written information will be located and passed out at doctor offices, health departments, and other public locations.

Section IV: In Antigua and Guatemala City, two safe shelters will be established in each city. One will be a female shelter while the other one will be a family shelter, open to all.

Section V: The resources and funding for the police and government officials will come from UNODC. The shelters will be funded and staffed by UNCTOC (United Nations Convention against Transnational Organized Crime).

Section VI: Upon the passage of this proposal, shelters will undergo renovation, the UNODC fund will be set apart and the preventive methods will be issued.
