Title: An act to to create a UN Foundations Logistics Database (UNFLD).

## BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Justification Clause: Within the UN there are over 30 different humanitarian aid agencies. Each agency has its own leadership and budget processes. Half of United Nations affiliated organizations report annually to the Economic and Social Council while the other half report to the General Assembly. All agencies are under the UN Foundations branch. Throughout the year these agencies don't interact with each other. Agencies are not required to explain exactly what funding was put into, the amount of supplies that they have in storage and they are not required to report what amount of supplies and/or funding was put into one area. When agencies report to the General Assembly or Economic and Social Council they are generally just expected to show what progress they have made.

Section 1: In order for the UN to ensure that their affiliated agencies are using funding and supplies in the most efficient and effective way possible a UN Foundations Logistics Database must be created. The UNFLD would be monitored by the UN Foundations Council and reviewed quarterly by the General Assembly or Economic and Social Council (which ever body the agency is currently required to report to annually).

Section 2: Agencies would be required to record all transactions and supply levels on the database. They will also be required to record how much money they had at the beginning and end of each month. Agencies will also record where they distributed supplies and how much of each supply was distributed. All information must be updated monthly. This information will allow the UN to organize all agencies in the most effective way possible.

Section 3: The development and implementation of the UNFLD will not cost the UN any more money than it currently spends, as current UN employees will be developing the database.

Section 4: The agencies will be given five months after completion of the database to start entering the required information. After five months, agencies will be expected the update their information monthly. If an agency will has not entered information in the database after the five month period, or if they have not updated their information by the deadline they will be issued a warning and put on a five month probation period. If they fail to enter/update their information after the probation period then the leader or leaders of the offending agency will be assessed by the UN Foundations Council. The Council will vote on whether they think the agency leader/leaders are fit to run the agency. If the majority of The Council finds the leader/leaders to be corrupt then the case will be taken to the General Assembly or Economic and Social Council (which ever body the agency is currently required to report to annually). The General Assembly or Economic and Social Council will then vote on if they think the leader/leaders are fit to lead. If the majority votes that the leader is not fit then their job at the agency will be terminated. If they are found to be fit to lead then they will be given a five month period to enter/update their agency's information in the UNFLD. If they fail to do so in the allotted time period then their job will be terminated. Section 5: The development of the UNFLD will begin immediately after passage of this proposal.
