Title: **An act to Stop Human Trafficking in Georgia**

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

**Justification Clause:**

Georgia is a Eurasian country that has a severe problem with human trafficking. On average, four million people are kidnapped and trafficked as slaves each year. The current punishment for a human trafficker is that of a minimum of 20 years in prison, a punishment concurrent with other major crimes such as rape. Yet this does not improve the dire situation of human trafficking in Georgia. Our proposal to try and solve this problem is to:

**Section I:** Increase the amount of trained personnel that can identify possible trafficking locations and offenders

**Section II:** Provide more funding to organizations that help prevent human trafficking

**Section III:** Increase the amount of public service announcements about the problems of human trafficking and solutions.

**Section IV:** Payments for these provisions will be provided for in a variety of forms including: Fines paid by those caught for human trafficking (50,000 each), new improvements and consolidations in the tax code that took place in 2011, money gained from the multi-million dollar tourist industry (one of the top booming industries in Georgia), grants from the government; a practice that became possible due to legislation in December 2011.

**Section V:** This would go into effect as of June 1, 2014.
