Title: An act to promote universal education through a national teacher training program.

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Justification Clause: Currently in our world many children are being denied a proper education due to the lack of educated teachers. In many countries children are being turned away simply because there isn't anyone to teach them. This in turn is creating a roadblock in meeting the millennium development goal of universal education. By offering trained teachers incentives to teach those willing in other countries we can make great strides in creating an educated world.

Section I: This program would allow anyone who has obtained a bachelor's degree in education to travel to a country which struggles with education for 6 months and conduct workshops to better train civilians to educate the children in that country.

Section II: This program will be overseen by the United Nations. Volunteers will be compensated for their first 6 months with payment of 20% of the cost of their bachelor's degree, coverage of travel costs, housing, and food. They will only receive payment for the first trip, but if they choose to volunteer more than once they will still receive travel cost coverage, housing, and food while serving.
