Title: An act for the funding of the planning and construction of U.N. learning centers across the world.

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Justification Clause: One of the primary goals of the United Nations is to spread quality education to all corners of the globe. Currently there are only 8 UNESCO Institutes of Lifelong Learning in the world and the majority of these centers are in highly developed nations. Many of the countries that lack acceptable education establishments do not have the means to support such institutions. UNESCO is responsible for providing a superior education and should create the necessary facilities where they are most needed.

Section I: This proposal will establish a program for the building of more UNESCO learning centers. At least half of schools to be created will be built in nations with literacy rates below 60%.

Section II: These institutions would be free and accessible to all wishing to attend them.

Section III: Funding for these learning centers would come from grants from UN education partners such as the EFA, the GPE, and the UNGEI. Education donors such the European Union, the DAC, and Development Banks would also contribute assets to the building of these learning centers. Any remaining costs would be paid for by the United Nations

Section IV: Those who attend and graduate from these institutions will be required to perform either civil or military service for the United Nations for a period lasting four years in order to offset the costs of the free education they received.

Section V: This proposal will go into effect immediately upon passage.
