Subject: An act to prevent the spread of aids in Rwanda by informing citizens about the disease.

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS.

Justification Clause: After the genocide in 1994 Rwanda started facing many more problems. Thousands of women were captured and raped repeatedly by soldiers. This resulted in an Aids outburst throughout the nation. The disease is spreading quickly causing many deaths due to a lack of contraceptives and knowledge on the matter.

Section I: There are multiple ways in which to prevent the spread of aids, and prevent people from getting the deadly disease all together. Commonly discussed spreading preventions include the use of contraceptives, vaccines and an educational standpoint on the disease. The USAID/Higa Ubeho organization is currently in a 5 year, 63 million dollar plan (starting in 2009); reaching out and providing facts and knowledge about aids to thousands of families in Rwanda. This organization needs more funding and to extend the current plan until 2018 which would allow for more families to be reached all across Rwanda.

Section II: USAID/Higa Ubeho is funded by the United States Agency for International Development (USAID) and the U.S. President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief (PEPFAR). By having the U.N. fund 3 more years of this project will allow it to reach roughly 45 thousand more families. This will cost the U.N. 38 million dollars.

Section III: This proposal will go into effect of the year 2015. This long time frame is because the current program timeframe lasts until October 2014. If deemed successful throughout the nation, these organizations can travel elsewhere throughout sub-Saharan Africa.
