Title: **An act to provide an international worker program**

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Subject: An act to provide an international worker program that would establish a similar effect to FDR's new deal and give the unemployed an opportunity to work while jumpstarting the national economies.

Enacting Clause: Be it hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the UN.

Body:

Section One: Workers will be given international job opportunities wherever in the world they can be allocated, examples include mining in Africa, working on a plantation in South America, or manufacturing in Asia. The workers will be assigned to the closest possible region in order to ensure cultural stability as well as worker morale.

Section Two: This program must be tested before it can be put into motion, therefore Zimbabwe will be used as a test bed in order to confirm the usefulness of this proposal.

Section Three: This program is not forceful, and anyone who becomes a part may opt out with previous indication to the working body in order to give time to find a replacement. Moreover, countries may opt out if they so choose. Companies may also opt out if they give a good grievance, such as the danger of worker harm.

Section Three: Eligibility will be determined in part by a country's census; exclusions will include major offenders such as mass murderers and the criminally insane.

Section Four: If a workplace is found to break any international labor laws then this program would withdraw its workers and turn the companies over to the UN to proceed with further investigation. All the workers will be placed in other workplaces.
