Title: **An act to use UN Peace Keepers to protect citizens from drug cartels in Mexican states where cartels have put citizens at high risk for violence**

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Justification Clause:

Over 26,000 people are currently missing from Mexican border states. Churches, schools, hospitals, and tourists spots have all been targets of kidnappings, drive by shootings, bombings, and assassinations. The current government has stepped away from the issue, and we recognize that we need help in protecting the common, average citizen from these dangerous cartels.

Section I: Peace keepers will be made up of multinational forces. Mexican troops are often blackmailed through fear of death or familial death into not fighting these drug lords. Peace keepers will have more freedom to stop these cartels from targeting neutral targets such as schools, hospitals, etc. The troops will be placed at these types of locations only and help with protection of them.

Section II: Troops will only engage cartel IF they decide to attack a neutral location. Troops will not be seeking out drug trafficking or hunting down cartel leaders, etc. They are there only to protect citizens from random acts of violence, or planned acts of violence against public places of infrastructure.

Section III: The UN will seek to establish a treaty with major cartel leaders to lead to protection of these places for a long term solution. Once,(if) a treaty has been reached, through mediation, etc, peace keeping forces will be removed.
