Title: An act to enforce select articles of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Justification Clause: The Universal Declaration of Human Rights is a declaration adopted by the United Nations assembly 1948, and represents a global expression of rights to which all human beings are inherently entitled. Currently, the declaration isn't being enforced and countries are not required to provide these rights to their citizens.

Section I: This proposal will enforce three articles from the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. The articles selected are found in Section IV of this proposal. The reason we are choosing three articles instead of all thirty articles to enforce is to begin the process of making all thirty articles enforceable. We feel these three articles handle the most inhumane and egregious situations throughout our world today, and they need to be eliminated in the fastest way possible.

Section II: Any violator of this proposal, be it government official or country, shall be tried in international court.

Section III: Punishment will be on a three strike basis, with the first two offenses resulting in a warning. The second resulting in a three month suspension. The third resulting in International Trial

First Offense: Warning

Second Offense: Warning, 3 month UN assembly suspension

Third Offense: International Trail

Section IV: These are the three articles that will be enforced upon passage:

- -Article 4- No one shall be held in slavery or servitude; slavery and the slave trade should be prohibited in all their forms.
- -Article 5- no one shall be subjected to torture, or to cruel, inhuman or degrading treatment punishment.
- -Article 13- (1) Everyone has the right to freedom of movement and residence within the borders of each state (2) Everyone has the right to leave any country, including his own, and to his country.

Enacting Clause: This proposal will go into effect three months after passage
