Title: An act to Eliminate Nuclear Energy Production.

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Justification Clause:

After the disaster of Chernobyl, the effects of Nuclear Radiation were felt very strongly in Austria. Our lakes were poisoned, plants and animals experienced fatal mutations which put many on the endangered lists. Because of this, Austria enacted an Anti-Nuclear Policy and shutdown all nuclear plants. Now, Austria is one of the worlds leading users of clean and renewable energies. We would like to propose that over the next 75 years, the UN Member Nations should gradually replace Nuclear Energy with cleaner, more environmentally friendly types of Energy.

SECTION I: Form The Nuclear Power Disestablishment Committee (NPDC) in the first year upon rectification of this proposal. This will monitor over the upkeep of the proposal. Upon rectification, this committee will assume responsibility for maintaining that the different sections of the proposal are followed.

SECTION II: Member Nations will Have 5 Years to formulate and enact a Plan to Gradually Eliminate all usage of Nuclear Power Facilities. These Plans will be submitted to and approved by the aforementioned Committee.

SECTION III: Over the next 75 years, member nations will work toward gradually eliminating Usage of Nuclear Power and research a more eco-friendly alternative. The 75 years will allow plenty of research time for new energy production methods to be created and tested.

SECTION IV: In order to be sure that this sanction will be followed, we recommend that the NPDC have the authority after 75 years, if a nation has not decreased or discontinued Nuclear power production, to increase tariff rates to said country, and, in extreme cases, to formulate a trade embargo until said country complies.
