Title: An act to establish mandatory human and environmental safety classes for all miners regulated by the United Nations

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Justification Clause: Many foreign miners enter Ghana and take advantage of its high concentration of minerals beneath the soil such as gold. They then flee the country with their profits and never contribute to Ghana's economy. It is causing death to many miners because of lack of education on mining techniques. The miners pollute streams and rivers in which many Ghanaians rely on.

Section I: The United Nations will use the money given to them through membership fees and money from the top importers of gold to fund the classes. Each country that imports gold from a developing country must pay a certain fee to fund the course according to the amount of gold imported.

Section II: This will be a (6) six month course (3) three days a week, lasting one hour each day. While taking this course, there will be supplemental pay to any person who would normally make less than \$2,000 a year.

Section III: After they pass the course, with a 60% grade average or higher, they will receive a certification card. This proves they have learned the material included in the human and environmental safety course.

Section IV: If someone is found mining without a certification card, all gold on sight will be collected and given to the United Nations to help fund the educational program. Also, a fee of \$500 equal to their currency will be charged to the person caught mining.

Section V: This proposal will be enacted by 2015, and by 2020 all miners must have their certification card or the punishment listed above will be implemented. This gives a five year period of time to take and pass the course.
