A proposal for the United Nations to officially recognize the attacks in the Darfur region of Sudan as genocide, send aid to Title: those who were effected by and survived these attacks, and implement sanctions on the Sudanese government.

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

SECTION I: The Arab government under the control of President Omar al-Bachir has trained an Arab militia called the Janjaweed to attack and burn the villages of black Africans in the Darfur region. The Janjaweed also uses rape as a tool of war to emotionally destroy families. Since the beginning of these attacks, and estimated 500,000 Sudanese people have been killed and 2.5 million people have been displaced from their homes.

SECTION II: The Janjaweed has been supplied with weapons bought by the Sudanese government and are paid with what is looted from the villages before its destruction. African villagers call the the Janiaweed the "devil on horseback".

SECTION III: The United Nations definition of genocide is the deliberate and systematic destruction, in whole or in part, of an ethnic, racial, religious, or national group. This definition fits the situation in Darfur.

SECTION IV: Many people in Darfur have suffered due to the government's planned attacks on their villages. This is why the United Nations should send humanitarian aid to Darfur. The cost of the humanitarian aid is undetermined but the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions will determine a maximum spending limit after reviewing the United Nations finances and implementing this proposal into the budget after its passage.

SECTION V: To act against and prevent further attacks in Darfur, it is proposed that the United Nations implement and enforce sanctions on Sudanese government. These sanctions will be determined by the United Nations Security Council as it is the council's duty to do so.

SECTION VI: If the Sudanese attempts to not allow humanitarian efforts into the region like they have done in the past, tighter sanctions will be enforced on the government until aid is allowed.

SECTION VII: The proposal will go into effect at the beginning of the United Nations new fiscal year so that way, it can effectively be worked into a budget and allow the Security Council time to create necessary sanctions.
