Title: An act to establish a government based humanitarian committee that will aid victims of human trafficking.

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Justification Clause:

After the 2002 legalization of prostitution, Germany has become a source, transit, and destination country for women and children subjected to sex trafficking. 85% of identified victims of human trafficking originated in Europe with 20% from within Germany itself. The German government only meets the bare minimum for the elimination of trafficking which places the victims in increased danger during and after prosecution of offenders.

Section I: The UN will assist in establishing a humanitarian committee that will aid victims of human trafficking.

Section II: The Committee will aid victims in vocational education, establishing a residency, and medical or psychological treatment.

Section III: The UN will work with the committee in returning any victims wishing to return to their native countries or helping reuniting the families of the victims of human trafficking.

Section IV: The Committee will provide the UN with information that will assist in the effort to fight human trafficking on an international level.

Section V: This proposal will go into effect immediately upon passage.
