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Title: **An act to create an alternative energy coalition in the Middle East.**

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Justification Clause: Iraq, along with many other Middle Eastern countries, has huge potential for alternative energy opportunities because of its geographic location. Added alternative energy will help stimulate the Middle East's economy, reduce their economic dependence on oil, stabilize their national governments, and help the world transition towards cleaner, more efficient sources of energy. A Middle Eastern alternative energy coalition, working through the United Nations, will allow Middle Eastern countries to cooperate and progress towards a cleaner, safer, and more efficient future.

Section I: The purpose of the coalition is to promote the production of alternative energy resources through international cooperation. Alternative energy methods such as wind power, solar power, hydropower, geothermal energy, and bio fuel will be promoted. Alternative energy, such as solar and wind energy, produce no carbon dioxide, making them much safer for the environment.

Section II: The coalition will be headquartered in Iraq. Requirements for entering and remaining apart of the coalition will be decided by the United Nations in cooperation with Iraq and other members of the coalition. Countries apart of the coalition will work together to produce alternative energy, in turn creating many new jobs, strengthening their economies, helping the environment, and promoting the needed change to alternative resources.

Section III: The United Nations will encourage countries that are a part of the coalition to provide tax breaks, along with other benefits, to privately owned companies working with the coalition to produce alternative energy.

Section IV: The United Nations along with nations who are coalition members will help provide any funding needed to financially support the coalition. The United Nations will also recognize the coalition for promoting the transition to alternative energy resources.
