Title: **An act to fund research toward the cure of skin cancer.**

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Justification Clause: The most heart-stopping event you'll ever feel is finding out you have cancer. Skin cancer is the most common cancer on Earth. Like other cancers, skin cancer is the uncontrollable growth of cells, which in this case, the growing cells are in the skin. The main cause of skin cancer is the sun.
