BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Justification Clause: It was the 26th of April 1986. It all started off with an unexpected power surge. When this occurred, an emergency power shut down was called for but lead to an even larger power surge. Due to this, the reactor vessels were damaged causing steam explosions.
