Title: An act to establish a program sponsored by the UNITED NATIONS that will send out rescue teams to aid countries in cases of disaster.

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

## Justification Clause:

In many UN countries, disaster occur. These disasters drastically harm the country's well being. For example: In Libya - there was a political upset that through the country off balance. In Haiti, the recent earthquake devastated the entire country. These crises have terrible effects on countries. The passage of this proposal would allow for aid to be offered to other countries.

Section I: UN countries would have the option of establishing rescue teams that will provide services to other countries in times of need or crisis. They would be deployed to a country who needs them to build homes, provide food or supplies, medical care, and other required or needed assistance.

Section II: Examples of these crises include: hurricanes, earthquakes, tsunamis, economic depression, political unrest, etc.

Section III: This program will provide paying jobs, funded by the UNITED NATIONS DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM (UNDP). The pay for the rescue teams will depend on the seriousness and gravity of the disaster. The UNDP will cover transportation, housing, and other necessary and required equipment, supplies, etc. The team members would be individually paid based on each deployment in which they serve.

Section IV: This program will also generate economic activity which will contribute to the well-being of each countries economy. The economic activity will not be limited to Belgium. As the deportation teams depart from their home country to help another country, better relations between countries involved will be forged. This can lead to increased trade and increased benefit.

Section V: The cost of this program will be entirely funded by the UNDP and will be approximately \$500,000. The economic benefits of this program will overshadow any expenses over time and give advantages to many countries.

Section VI: This proposal will go into effect 90 days after passage.
