Title: **An act to increase the amount of Pantanal Wetlands protected with laws to enforce and preserve the largest wetland in the world.**

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Justification Clause: The Pantanal Wetlands is the largest wetland system in the world. It contains hundreds of species of flora and fauna. Many endangered species like the jaguar, macaw, and giant river otter call this wetland home. These wetlands, however, are being threatened by pollution, growing population, and poisons. High levels of mercury have been found in fish and other animals in the Pantanal from nearby mining. If these harmful factors continue, many endangered species may become extinct. We propose to make laws to preserve one of nature's most beautiful and vulnerable places in South America.

Section I: The United Nations, on behalf of all of its delegated countries, will donate money to provide the protection of the Pantanal Wetlands.

Section II: The United Nations, on behalf of all of its delegated countries, will donate money to provide the conservation of the Pantanal Wetlands.

Section III: These laws will interfere with two other countries, Bolivia and Paraguay. All decisions for the passing of these laws will be considered by a simple majority vote and will have to be decided in the time of 60 days to make sure that no further harm will be done to the wetlands.

Section IV: These laws will enforce that whoever poaches/hunts, hurts, or in anyways interferes with the natural habitat of the Pantanal Wetlands will be punished by fines or jail time.
