Title: An act to make vaccines for Mediterranean Fever available to the general public of the Mediterranean sphere.

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Justification Clause: More than 4,000 people in the Mediterranean have this life-threatening fever. Making vaccines available to the public will help prevent this disease and save lives.

Section I: The government of Cyprus will set aside \$10,000 to go towards funding for the vaccines. This money will come from taxes paid by the people of Cyprus.

Section II: Countries in the Mediterranean will be asked to match or exceed the amount raised by Cyprus to help fund the vaccine research, production, and distribution.

Section III: In order to get the vaccine an individual will have to have a passport. This is for safety purposes and allows us to collect important information about the spread of the disease, who is receiving treatment, and where they are living within the Mediterranean sphere.

Section IV: Most clinics will have the vaccine made available to the public. Since symptoms start to show between the ages of 5 and 15, infants and young children will be the main recipients of the vaccine.

Section V: This bill will go into effect January 1st, 2014.
