Title: **An act to provide humanitarian aid to Djibouti by supplementing the existing Vapor program with UN funding to set up self-sustaining communities.**

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Justification Clause: The economy of Djibouti suffers from a very small GDP per capita - \$2700 - and has an unemployment rate of over 55%. Many people are living on meager incomes and suffering from disease and poverty. Djibouti owes 800 million dollars to other nations and cannot pay it off. Therefore the nation cannot sustain itself and is need of large amounts of humanitarian aid. Without urgent action, Djibouti will continue to be a bleak and tempestuous location.

Section I: VAPOR is a humanitarian aid organization that establishes centers in poverty rampid areas of the third world. One of VAPORS main advantages is that it establishes connections between the people they help and VAPOR representatives using sports such as soccer. They build fields and set up leagues. The communities grow around a common interest. The goal is to set up self-sustaining communities that will be run by the people of Djibouti.

Section II: VAPOR will set up a self-sustaining facility that will give impoverished people fresh food, portable water, and basic economic assistance. VAPOR will provide education and training in a safe learning environment for men and women to combat illiteracy and make the Djiboutian people more prepared for job opportunities.

Section III: This proposal will be paid by donation to UN and Humanitarian Aid. The UN donation will be to cover the cost of materials. The VAPOR organization will bring in the supplies and volunteers.

Section IV: This proposal will go into effect 90 days after passage.
