Title: **An act to preserve the memory of the victims under the reign of Joseph Stalin.**

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Justification Clause: Today in Lithuania the population is approximately 3,200,000 people. However, from 1941 to 1990 Lithuania had disappeared from all maps. A man named Joseph Stalin caused this. 20,000,000 people were tortured and harshly killed under Stalin's reign. It is important to our people to preserve our heritage and the memories of our ancestors.

Section I: The Memory Preservation Museum will be located in Vilnius, Lithuania. It will serve as a cultural education center dedicated to the victims of Stalin's reign.

Section II: This facility will be similar in nature and design to that of the Holocaust Museums. It would include stories of survival and exhibits.

Section III: The funding for this museum will be determined by the country after this proposal is approved. Volunteers will be needed from our own community to help with other nations, such as Lithuania; we can come together so the people that Joseph Stalin reigned over will be recognized.

Section IV: As members of the UN, countries should support this project because Lithuania is not the only country to ever be affected by genocide or a radical ruler. This project and museum could serve as a prototype for other countries to follow.

Section V: This project will take up to five years after its ratification.
