Title: **An act to use UNICEF funding to put an end to street children whose problems lead to solvent abuse.**

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Justification Clause: In Nicaragua, and its surrounding countries, where two-fifths of the earth's 100 million street children live, inhalant abuse, particularly glue-sniffing, is pandemic: and it is a legal and profitable business for many corporations worldwide. All funding will come from donations and contributions from individuals, foundations and corporations around the world.

Section I: UNICEF provides funding to build technologically advanced adolescent rehabilitation centers with staff trained to deal with solvent abuse that has become an addiction

Section II: United Nations places restriction on any packaging of shoe glue imports to no more than 12 ounces.

Section III: UNICEF provides funding for shelter, education and food for the children. This education must include the consequences of inhalant abuse, and provide the children education to develop the ability to enter society with skills needed to be accepted into an occupation.

Section IV: United Nations requires that companies that import glue to this region to substitute the substance "Toulene" with "Formula 66" in shoe glue. This change will make the glue non-toxic and still have the same result.

Section V: This proposal will go into effect 60 days after passage.
