Title: An act to create boarding schools for girls ages 8-20 in Pakistan.

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Justification Clause:

Women are discriminated against in Pakistan and dependent on males for their livelihood. Many girls aren't allowed to go to school or have a job outside the home. This gender inequality prevents women from being truly independent and free. By creating boarding schools for girls to receive an education, women will be better education resulting in better jobs and greater independence and freedom.

Section I:

We are proposing that the United Nations Human Rights Organization assist Pakistan in building 10 boarding schools for girls in Pakistan. Each boarding school will have 55 classrooms, living quarters and be staffed by females.

Section II:

By allowing girls to get an education with other girls and by women, they will gain confidence and have role models to show them that women can be successfully employed in their country and not have to be dependent on men.

Section III:

The cost for building the boarding schools is roughly \$50,000. Pakistan will provide the labor and operating costs and the United Nations will provide \$500,000 for the building materials for the schools.
