Title: An act to create incentives for South American countries to interdict the manufacturing of cocaine.

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Justification Clause: Some 16 to 17 million people globally used cocaine in 2007 to 2008. Almost 470 metric tons of cocaine are used around the world annually. Most of the world's cocaine is produced in South America and shipped to North America and Europe, which consume more than 80% of the world's cocaine. The sale of cocaine drains economies on both ends of the \$88 billion trade. This proposal aims to increase government actions against cocaine production.

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS:

Section I: The United Nations will offer a loan to the economy of any nation that succeeds in ceasing a percentage of its cocaine production. The details of said loan will be decided by the panel created in section two.

Section II: The United Nations will allocate a small amount of funds to create a group who will further specify on topics such as the leniency of the loan, the universality of the program, and the amount of the loan based on the amount of cocaine production the government has brought to an end.

Section III: Any country wishing to gain monetary benefits from this loan will consent to submitting locations of cocaine manufactories to the United Nations and will host a panel from the U.N. once before the loan takes effect, once six months after, once one year after, once two years after, once five years after, and once ten years after to inspect the given locations and to check for evidence of cocaine manufacturing.

Section IV: If the panel decides that the nation is not successful in ceasing cocaine production in given locations, the U.N. may revoke the loan, and the country may try again at any time. If the country goes ten years without any issues in the given locations, the loan will become permanent.

Section V: Funding for this program will come from the same fund that already goes to preventing global sale of narcotics.

Section VI: This proposal will take effect 90 days after passage.
