Title: An act to establish a medical exchange program throughout the U.N.

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Justification Clause: As of 2001, there are 30.6 million Filipinos suffering from poverty and, thus, cannot afford reliable healthcare. Many hospitals are understaffed and running over with patients. They lack the supplies and equipment necessary for treating these people. The medical staff itself is limited and ambulances are sent without EMS personnel, resulting in many deaths before ever reaching the hospital. Like the Philippines, many other third world countries endure similar healthcare conditions.

Section I: In order to establish this medical exchange program and improve the healthcare of the Philippines and other third world countries, this proposal requires a U.N. fund to be established for medical purposes.

Section II: The fund established in Section I would require all countries with at least a 65% healthcare success rate to take part in the program. These countries would be required to contribute either financially, by sending supplies and equipment, or exchanging medical personnel.

Section III: This medical program will improve Filipino healthcare by providing hospitals with needed equipment, educating the children on first aid and prevention of disease, and training apprentices to work in the medical field.

Section IV: If passed, this proposal would be enacted on January 1, 2014, in order to begin building the fund and assisting needy countries with their healthcare. Those countries that must participate, will be required to begin contribution by 2015.
