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Title: **An act to use incentives to encourage companies to build factories in undeveloped countries to facilitate economic growth.**

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Justification Clause:

In Samoa, poverty is widespread. Citizens are migrating to more developed lands due to bad living conditions that have decreased the economy exponentially. Out of 188,000 people, 12.2% of the population is unemployed, 20% is under the national poverty line and 60% have migrated to Hawaii or the US mainland because of these living conditions

Section I:

Companies can choose from a list of UN countries whose imports are greater than their exports. In doing so, they will bring a vast amount of jobs and income which will increase the economy.

Section II:

Companies that move their factories into countries whose imports are greater than their exports will be given incentives such as lower tax rates, and a discount of shipping costs. The UN will pay a fraction (10%) of the cost of the building of the factory if a suitable building is not available. They will also pay for supports in relocating personnel and training local employees.

Section III:

The countries that believe that they meet the requirements will apply to be on the list and will be evaluated by the United Nations. Companies who wish to relocate their companies will apply through the same department and suitable matches (between company and country) will be made.

Section IV:

The UN will not profit from the company's revenue. The United Nations will work to keep relationships strong and balanced between the company and the country.

Section V:

This proposal will go into effect 90 days after passage.
