Title: **An act to work with the Saudi Arabian women to protect their human rights.**

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS

Justification clause: Saudi Arabian women are limited in basic human rights such as: being educated--20% of the women are less literate than males; not being allowed to have a job outside of the home--only 5% of women make up the workforce; being punished for speaking publicly about their lack of rights; being forbidden from traveling outside their country or driving a car without permission from a male relative; and not being protected from sexual abuse by any laws, even risking being killed if they do speak out.

Section I: The United Nations shall ratify this proposal by creating the following programs to protect the rights of Saudi Arabian women citizens.

Section II: Set up shelters for abused women to provide medical care, food, and psychological counseling.

Section III: Set up social media web sites for Saudi women to access so they can be made aware of their conditions compared to women around the world, as well as receive psychological counseling.

Section IV: Create videos through social media of the Saudi women's lack of human rights so the rest of the world is made aware and can bring pressure to the Saudi government.

Section V: Keep the UN Human Rights Council informed of progress or lack of progress.
